This year, we'll walk both Land Trust preserves as well as town properties highlighting the unique features that make these open spaces very special places in town.



National Poetry Month Hike Sunday April 13, 1-3 PM

We will celebrate National Poetry Month with a hike in Mendell's Folly to introduce the Land Trust's Poetry in the Wild initiative. Jeanne LeVasseur, professor emeritus at Quinnipiac University and Vice President, Connecticut Poetry Society, will be our guide. We will be stopping at poetry trail kiosks along the path to listen to readings of nature themed poems.

Early Morning Birding Adventure Sunday May 4, 8-10 AM

Join us with your binoculars and spotting scopes for a morning walk in Mendell's Folly with guide, Christin Arnini, as we welcome back species returning from migration. Space limited to 10 hikers.

Trails Day 2025: Complete the Northwest Loop Hike Sunday June 8, 1-4 PM

To celebrate National Trails Day, we will hike along the second of Land Trust's loop trails. The Northwest Loop



winds through the Land Trust Preserves, town properties, and the Naugatuck State Forest in the northwest section of Bethany. This one will be challenging.

and Grace Kenney. This event is kid-friendly, but please note that it involves a short 0.3-mile hike to the survey site in Whispering Pines.

Magic of Wetlands Hike Sunday September 7, 1-3 PM

Learn with our Guide, Ali Beres-Nork, how wetlands sustain a huge number of plant and animal species, improve water quality, reduce erosion and flooding, and help moderate the effects of climate change.

Join us for a walk along the trails in Veterans Memorial Park and in the Town's newly acquired Simpson Preserve.
